1. For more effective removal of rubbish and to implement the ideals of “waste reduction” and “recycling,” all the student dormitories are to recycle.
2. Rubbish collection in the dormitories should have a general rubbish collection area and recycling area.
3. In the recycling area it recycles –
 - (a) Containers: glass, bottles, aluminium (metal) cans, foils...etc.
 - (b) Papers: old newspapers, magazines and wastepaper...etc.
 - (c) Mercury batteries...etc.
 - (d) Clothes...etc.
4. Remaining juice in the container should be cleaned and compressed before being recycled.
5. To avoid shards of glass mixed with general rubbish and to cause harm to hands, glass should be put into glass recycling.
6. Lunch boxes and shiny advertisement papers cannot be put into Paper recycling.
7. Individuals should separate the rubbish for recycling in their bedroom before they carry the rubbish to the recycling area. Then put them into general rubbish collection or recycling according to their classification.
8. The school will have contractor to collect and remove the rubbish each week.
9. Any recyclable items in the dormitories the collection can be assisted by Student Housing Life Improvement Unit or work-study service student.
